1 Numazu Deep Sea Aquarium

沼津港深海水族館シーラカンス・ミュージアム

Facing Suruga Bay, the deepest bay in Japan, this is the world's first aquarium specializing in displaying deep sea creatures. It is the only place in the world to see frozen coelacanths, which are called “living fossils.”

1 Senbonhama Park

A large park for people to relax. The pine forest “Senbon Matsubara” is a historic scenic site, which has been favored by many writers and has several stone monuments inscribed with poems and words by Japanese literary masters here and there. You can enjoy a pleasant bicycle ride on the promenade along the breakwater while looking at the great scenery with the beautiful green pine forest, the bright blue sky, and the majestic Mt. Fuji in the distance.

2 Mt. Kanuki

The mountain offers a casual hiking spot, where it takes about one hour from the starting point to the mountain peak. From the observatory, you can have a panoramic view of the city center of Numazu along with Suruga Bay, and on a clear day you can even see Mt. Fuji behind Mt. Ashitaka. Koryodai Park, located halfway to the top of the mountain, has a 5-story cenotaph monument, and it is a great place to view gorgeous cherry blossoms in spring.

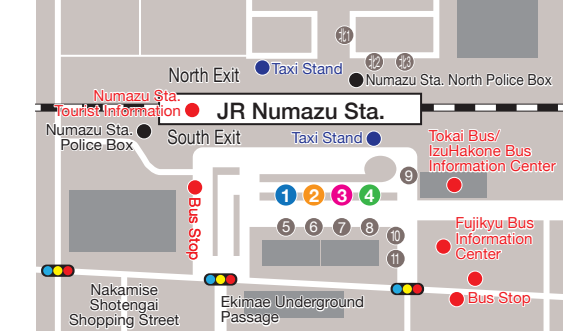

### How to Use a Bus

- When getting on the bus, touch your transportation IC card on the card reader or take a numbered ticket.
- When you hear an announcement referring to your destination bus stop, push a stop button near you.
- Touch your transportation IC card on the card reader. (If you don't have an IC card, put the numbered ticket you took when you get on the bus into the fare box, along with cash for bus fare)
